HELPING HOMELESS VETERANS WITH A FRESH START

Illinois is home to more than 900,000 Veterans from World War II to the current War in the Middle East. In the Chicago Metro area alone, more than 1,000 Veterans are homeless on any given night and more than 18,000 are homeless at some point during the year.

To meet the needs of homeless veterans, Volunteers of America of Illinois (VOA of IL) launched the Homeless Veterans Reintegration Program (HVRP). The program's goal is to help homeless veterans achieve economic self-sufficiency and overall stability in their lives with the support, training and opportunities needed to secure and maintain viable, long-term employment.
